A Name Changes, A Mission Endures

Disability Law Colorado Becomes Disability Justice

DENVER, CO — Disability Law Colorado is now Disability Justice, marking a new chapter for the 50-year-old civil rights organization. The agency also launched a new website, logo, and visual identity.

“Our name has changed, but our mission endures,” said Executive Director **Andrew Romanoff**. “We aim to make Colorado the best place in America for people with disabilities to live, work, and thrive.”

Disability Justice serves as Colorado’s Protection and Advocacy system. The organization’s 25 advocates, attorneys, and investigators represent more than one million Coloradans in the battle against discrimination, abuse, and neglect.

“The law is one of the means we use,” said Communications Manager **Felix Ortiz**, explaining the name change. “Justice is the goal.”

Disability Justice responds to more than 3,000 requests for assistance each year, providing Coloradans with self-advocacy tools and other resources. The organization’s new website, disabilityjustice.co, makes those resources more accessible.

“It’s often said that ‘Justice delayed is justice denied,’” Digital Resource Specialist **Kendall Graham** noted. “We want to make sure that all Coloradans get the support they need to secure justice now.”
